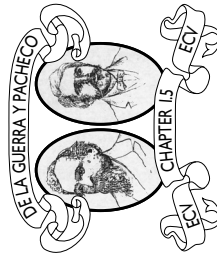
## DIRECTIONS TO THE DESPARADO HIDEOUT

# THE PECHO COAST

For over 15,000 years the Pecho Coast was home to Native Peoples who fed themselves on abundant seafood and wild terrestrial game. Black bears, Pumas, and foxes still call the Pecho their home.

Early explorers barely mention the Pecho, and it was a possible smuggling route during the Spanish Mission days. During the Mexican Rancho Period it contained three large ranchos: San Miguelito, Pecho y Islay and La Cañada de Los Osos. The latter two were combined into one huge ranch in 1846.

This was training ground for some of our most famous desperadoes, pistoleros and Vaqueros like Pio Linares who was hunted down and shot on the Eastern side of the Pecho.

The Pecho Coast is home to Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant which will stop operation in 2025. Operating since 1985, the spent fuel is all stored on-site despite a mandate under the 1982 Nuclear Waste Policy Act to designate a National underground repository. Regardless of the uncertain future of it’s nuclear waste, potential buyers are circling the surrounding Pecho property like buzzards!
